'The Loving Story' screened here

The PWC Bar Association, together with the Old Dominion Bar Association and the Prince William Chapter of the Virginia Women Attorneys Association, co-hosted a screening of the documentary, "The Loving Story" on Sept. 20.

More than 100 people attended.

The documentary chronicles the legal case, *Loving v. Virginia*, a landmark U.S. Supreme Court case that invalidated Virginia's law against interracial marriage in 1967.

Bernard Cohen, one of the attorneys who fought and won the case, attended the screening.

His daughter, Karen Cohen, introduced him. She is an attorney with the Manassas law firm of Vanderpool, Frostick and Nishanian, which co-sponsored the event.

A motion picture based on the documentary will be released in theaters in November.
