

CONSTITUTION OF THE PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION
Manassas, Va.

ARTICLE I.
Name of Association

Section 1. This association shall be known as the Prince William County Bar Association.

ARTICLE II.
Objects

Section 1. The particular objects and business of this Association are: To maintain the honor and dignity of the profession of the law, and increase its usefulness in promoting the due administration of justice, and the mutual improvement and social intercourse of its members.

ARTICLE III.
Membership

Section 1. Any member of the legal profession in good standing, who is actively engaged in the practice of law and maintains a bona fide office within the county, and who pays the Virginia State License tax to the Treasurer's Office of Prince William County, may become a member of this Association, upon a vote of the Association, upon subscribing to the Constitution and By-Laws, and submitting evidence that he is a member of the Virginia Integrated Bar.

Section 2. The Judge of the Circuit Court and the Clerk of the Circuit Court shall be Honorary members of this Association, and such other Honorary members may be added from time to time as the Association may desire. Such members shall be without the power to vote.

ARTICLE IV
Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Association shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. The duties of these officers shall be such as are usually imposed upon such officers or such duties as may be specially prescribed in the By-Laws.

Section 3. All officers of the Association shall be elected for a term of one year and no person shall be President for more than two terms consecutively. Election of officers shall be held at the June meeting of each year, and the officers-elect shall be installed at the following meeting.

Section 4. The term of all officers shall commence as of the next meeting following the June meeting of each year.

ARTICLE V
Committees

Section 1. The president may appoint such committees as he may deem necessary to properly conduct the affairs of this Association.

ARTICLE VI
Amendments

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended by a two thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the Association, provided that notice of the proposed amendment, subscribed by three members, be given at a previous meeting.

HELD THE 25TH DAY OF JULY, 1941.


At a meeting of the Prince William County Bar Association held at the office of T. E. Didlake in The Peoples National Bank Building in the Town of Manassas, Virginia, on the 25th day of July, 1941, the following members were present: Robert A. Hutchison, C. A. Sinclair, T. E.
